St. Luke's highly-trained, compassionate care team customizes rehab plans for cancer survivors' physical and emotional healing.

The comprehensive program is available to survivors of all forms of cancer. A compassionate, highly-trained team of caregivers, including physicians, physical and occupational therapists, speech therapists, dietitians, social workers and more, works with each patient on a personalized rehabilitation plan to address all the conditions they experience after their cancer treatment. These efforts can help them increase strength and energy, alleviate pain and improve daily function.
