# Circle of care



St. Luke's Hospital was founded in 1866 to provide a healing ministry to meet the expanding needs of a vibrant and growing St. Louis. What began as a single hospital nearly 150 years ago has grown to include an entire network of services, providing care across 25 locations and more than 60 specialty areas. Today, St. Luke's is a nonprofit regional healthcare provider that offers a complete "circle of care," providing comprehensive health and wellness services for every stage of life.

Each year, positive financial results allow us to invest in quality staff, capital expenditures and growth of services for our community, including:

- **Recruitment and retention of quality staff and physicians** - In 2014, 34 new physicians joined the St. Luke's medical staff in specialties ranging from primary care, neurology and oncology to cardiovascular, orthopedics and plastic surgery.
- **Investment in buildings, equipment and new technology** - Several areas received major renovations this year, including Maternity Services, Surgical Services, Women's Services and St. Luke's Surrey Place, our skilled nursing facility. In 2014, St. Luke's opened a new facility to bring the state's only Open Upright MRI scanner to St. Louis, and opened a new Urgent Care Center at Ladue Crossing.
- **Growth and expansion of services** - St. Luke's remains committed to meeting the evolving health needs of the community. Demand for services continued to grow in 2014, particularly in outpatient services, Home Health and Hospice.

In a time of healthcare reform and economic changes, we are more committed than ever to being good stewards of our resources. As an independent, nonprofit organization, all of the excess of revenues over expenses and charitable contributions received are reinvested in St. Luke's. A strong financial year like 2014 better positions us for the future, allowing us to continue the vision of our founders, strengthen the circle of care we provide and improve the quality of life for patients and the community.

# St. Luke's offers a full array of services to support the beginning of life, including:

- Obstetrical and Gynecological Services
- Neonatal Special Care Nursery
- Infertility Services
- Perinatal Center and high-risk pregnancy services
- Genetic Counseling
- Comprehensive Maternity Services
- Childbirth and Maternity classes

In 2014, St. Luke's completed a major phase of a multi-year renovation to its **Maternity Services**. Designed to benefit patients and families, the all-private Birth Care Suites were remodeled with new furniture and décor, walk-in showers or labor tubs, and new artwork and lighting selected to provide an even more homelike environment. New family and visitor waiting areas were added and the well baby nursery was completely remodeled. In an earlier phase, the St. Luke's level II neonatal unit, The Saigh Foundation Special Care Nursery, was extensively renovated to integrate newer technology and state-of-the-art design for the care of premature babies and other newborns needing advanced medical care.



# St. Luke's breadth of services and many locations support families with children at every age.

From wellness services to emergency and hospital services, St. Luke's offerings for pediatric patients include:

- Hospital Pediatrics Unit
- St. Luke's Pediatric Care Center in North St. Louis County, serving medically underserved and underinsured children
- St. Luke's Urgent Care Centers – 7 locations
- St. Luke's Convenient Care for minor illnesses and injuries – located in Dierbergs Des Peres
- Emergency Room
- Access on St. Luke's campus and across its network of facilities to pediatric specialists and surgeons in nearly all specialties

After opening one of the first **Urgent Care Centers** in the St. Louis area nearly 30 years ago, St. Luke's now offers seven convenient locations for prompt minor emergency care for patients 6 months to adult. Each hospital-affiliated center, including the newest one in Ladue, provides care seven days a week and many holidays through its staff of board-certified physicians, nurse practitioners, registered nurses and X-ray and lab technicians. Onsite lab and X-ray services provide an added convenience for families.



# As a regional healthcare provider committed to improving health and wellness at all stages of life,

St. Luke's offers more than 60 specialty areas, including cardiovascular care and surgery, cancer care, neurosurgery and neurology, orthopedics, pulmonology, maternity and other women's health, general medicine, outpatient services and comprehensive surgical services. Many have been recognized for quality, ranking in the top 5 or 10% in the nation.

St. Luke's offers a wide range of therapy services, wellness programs and community education to help individuals of all ages maintain their quality of life.

Always looking to ensure the community has access to beneficial medical advances and technology, in 2014 St. Luke's Hospital and St. Luke's Center for Diagnostic Imaging opened **Open Upright MRI of Missouri**, offering the state's only Open Upright MRI scanner. The new facility, centrally located in Creve Coeur, offers people who are claustrophobic, or fear being in enclosed spaces, a new option when it comes to receiving prescribed magnetic resonance imaging (MRI). It also offers unique positional imaging capabilities where patients can be scanned sitting, standing or in other positions if they feel pain.



# Whether it's helping individuals recover from illness or injury, or live with disease,

St. Luke's provides services focused on preserving quality of life through:

- Home Health Services
- Senior Solutions - assistance to seniors within the St. Louis metropolitan area currently living in their own homes, retirement communities, assisted living and nursing facilities
- St. Luke's Rehabilitation Hospital
- St. Luke's Surrey Place skilled nursing facility

**St. Luke's Surrey Place** is an important piece in the continuum of healthcare services St. Luke's offers the community. The 120-bed skilled nursing facility located just three miles west of St. Luke's Hospital provides residential private rooms, assisted living, skilled nursing, long-term care, short-term rehabilitation, Alzheimer's and dementia care, therapy services and spiritual care. To better meet the needs of residents and their families, in 2014 Surrey Place completed a renovation with updates to flooring, colors and décor, as well as completely remodeled outdoor spaces with water features, grills and fireplaces. In 2014, St. Luke's Surrey Place was named a Best Nursing Home by *U.S. News and World Report* based on health inspections, safety, nursing staffing and quality measures.



# From the beginning of the circle to the end, every stage of life is sacred.

Recognizing this, St. Luke's offers services to support patients living with life-limiting illness, as well as their families, in physical, emotional, spiritual and social ways, including:

- Palliative Care
- Hospice Services
- Pastoral Care
- Social Services

With a focus on comfort and care,

**Hospice Services** offers a specialized way of attending to patients who are nearing the end of their lives in the comfort of their homes. Identifying a need for this type of service in the community, St. Luke's added Hospice Services in 2010. Each year, the number of patients and families it helps continues to grow. Last year saw an 17% growth.





# Highlights

## Facilities

### Women's Center Renovation

The St. Luke's Women's Center at the hospital recently completed a major renovation. The newly renovated center offers greater convenience and comfort for patients, as well as a beautiful, patient-friendly designed space. The redesigned center also now allows women to receive all their breast health services in one centralized location, including digital screening and diagnostic mammograms, breast ultrasound, SonoCine (whole breast ultrasound for women with dense breasts), biopsies and cyst aspirations (MRI, stereotactic and ultrasound-guided), surgical consultations, and a high-risk breast clinic.

### Surgical Services Expansion

This year, St. Luke's began a multi-year renovation to expand and enhance its Surgical Services, which includes operating rooms, Same-Day Surgery services and family waiting rooms. It also means the relocation of Laboratory Services, which will be completely remodeled.

### Continued Outpatient Growth

Paralleling a growth in outpatient services, more physician offices and outpatient services were added to the Mr. and Mrs. Theodore P. Desloge, Jr. Outpatient Center, which offers outpatient radiology, imaging, cardiology, vascular, laboratory and therapy services.

## Technology

St. Luke's is committed to offering patients the most advanced care with state-of-the-art technology. The addition of the Open Upright MRI scanner to its services in 2014 is just one example of that. Other recent technology investments include:

- **Hybrid operating room** for advanced cardiac and vascular procedures
- **Robotic-assisted surgery** with the daVinci Surgical System for complex, minimally-invasive surgeries
- **Linear accelerator** equipped with image-guided radiation therapy, one of the most precise and powerful cancer treatment technologies available
- **Electrophysiology Lab** for advanced technological procedures to study the heart's electrical function
- **Two state-of-the-art intensive care units** for patients requiring critical care
- **Upgraded magnetic resonance imaging (MRI)** equipment to offer the latest diagnostic tools



## Medical Staff Recruiting the Best

St. Luke's continues to successfully recruit and retain high quality medical staff in many specialties. Thirty-four new physicians joined the medical staff in 2014, representing nearly everything from primary care and medical specialties like cardiology, oncology, neurology and sleep medicine, to many pediatric and surgical sub-specialties.

## Communication

### Electronic Medical Record

In March 2014, St. Luke's launched *mystlukes*, a free, secure online tool that allows patients or designated family members to conveniently access health records online. It offers hospital discharged patients access to lab results, diagnoses information, vital signs, medication lists, allergy lists, procedure information, immunization history and hospital discharge instructions, as well as the ability to pay bills online, sign up for healthy living classes and link to educational materials and community resources related to their health. Later this year, St. Luke's will be expanding *mystlukes* to include many physician offices.

### Consumer Health Website

Understanding that women are often the gatekeepers for their entire family's health needs, St. Luke's launched a new consumer-focused website in 2014 specifically for women. The health site, at [stlukes-stl.spirithealth.com](http://stlukes-stl.spirithealth.com), offers general health, diet and fitness information, screening guidelines and recipes, and highlights relevant health programs and events.

### Affordable Care Act

With the implementation of the Affordable Care Act and the opening of the Health Insurance Marketplace in 2014, St. Luke's recognized a need for patients and the community to have resources to help answer questions. In preparation, several St. Luke's employees were trained and designated as certified application counselors to assist patients with enrollment in one of the available health plans and to answer questions.

## Quality

### Value-Based Purchasing

Value-Based Purchasing is a program of the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services to reimburse acute-care hospitals based on the quality of care they provide. St. Luke's ranks #1 among nearly 150 hospitals in Missouri and #44 in the U.S. for 2014 Value-Based Purchasing.

### Mortality & Readmission

St. Luke's has lower 30-day mortality rates than the U.S. standard for Acute Myocardial Infarction (heart attack), Congestive Heart Failure and Pneumonia.

St. Luke's has one of the lowest 30-day readmission rates, placing it among the top performing 12% of hospitals in Missouri.

### Infections

St. Luke's infection rates are statistically better (lower) than the U.S. benchmark for these common hospital infections:

- Central line associated bloodstream infection
- Catheter associated urinary tract infections
- SSI Colon Surgery
- Clostridium Difficile (C.Diff)

# Honors, quality and patient experience

## Patient Satisfaction

Based on Hospital Consumer Assessment of Healthcare Providers and Systems (HCAHPS) data, St. Luke's has the highest ranking among the nearly 150 hospitals in Missouri for the question "would you recommend" and the second highest ranking in the state for receiving an overall hospital rating of 9 or 10. HCAHPS is a standardized survey instrument and data collection methodology for measuring patients' perspectives nationwide on hospital care.

### Operating Results

St. Luke's operating revenue in excess of expense for the fiscal year that ended June 30, 2014 was \$20,364,000, representing an operating margin of 4.3%. Based on the hospital activity shown above, total operating revenue grew to \$478 million, a 4.4% increase over the prior fiscal year.

### Community Benefit

As a nonprofit organization, St. Luke's Hospital is committed to its mission of improving the health of the community. In fiscal year 2014, St. Luke's provided unreimbursed services costing \$12 million in the form of charity and Medicaid discounts to uninsured and underinsured patients, helping individuals in our community access medical care regardless of their ability to pay.

In other efforts to improve the health of the community, St. Luke's partnered with area health and community organizations in 2013 to conduct a community health needs assessment. Based on those findings, St. Luke's developed a plan and is implementing programs focused on these three health priorities: obesity and sedentary lifestyle, cancer screenings and resources (including breast, lung and colon cancer), and prevention of chronic conditions (including hypertension and Diabetes Type 2).



### Mission

Faithful to our Episcopal-Presbyterian heritage, and its ministry of healing, St. Luke's Hospital is dedicated to improving the health of the community. Using talents and resources responsibly, our medical staff, employees and volunteers provide care for the whole person with compassion, professional excellence, and respect for each other and those we serve.

### Medical Staff

More than 800 physicians provide care in over 60 specialties. St. Luke's reputation for clinical quality, exceptional patient care and state-of-the-art facilities helps attract and retain high caliber physicians year after year.

### Employees

St. Luke's is able to provide quality care in more than 60 specialty areas and through 25 locations with the help of its 3,700 employees. Of those, 425 have dedicated more than 25 years of service to St. Luke's and its patients.



### Volunteer Services

Volunteers are an integral part of St. Luke's. They support the full circle of services at St. Luke's. In 2014, more than 400 volunteers between the ages of 14 and 92 provided more than 82,000 volunteer hours. From the Special Care Nursery to Hospice Services, they work in over 60 areas on the main campus, and at many St. Luke's locations across the community.

### Ministry

Central to St. Luke's Episcopal-Presbyterian heritage, St. Luke's Pastoral Care Department offers a ministry of presence to patients, families, visitors, staff and physicians throughout the circle of care, including as part of the care team for St. Luke's Hospice Services. Chaplains of various faith traditions provide around-the-clock pastoral care at St. Luke's Hospital, Surrey Place and Rehabilitation Hospital. St. Luke's also offers an accredited Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) program for persons of diverse faith traditions in preparation for serving as future clergy and CPE Supervisors for ministry.

### Community Outreach

Dedicated to improving the quality of life for patients and the community at every age, St. Luke's community outreach efforts provide thousands of health screenings, support groups, wellness programs, health talks and more each year, including a commitment to women's health education through St. Luke's Spirit of Women.

### Employee Wellness

Through an extensive worksite wellness program, St. Luke's partners with nearly 200 employers across the area to bring health screenings and education to worksites.

# Philanthropy

Philanthropic support enables St. Luke's to expand and enhance services and facilities that touch on every part of the circle of care.

## Total Charitable Giving

In fiscal year 2014 (July 1, 2013 – June 30, 2014), St. Luke's Hospital received over \$7.3 million in philanthropic giving. This includes more than \$3.6 million in unrestricted giving from individual donors, corporations and estates.

## Gary Olson Endowment Fund

Gifts from Jack C. Taylor, Jo Ann Taylor Kindle and the Crawford Taylor Foundation established the Gary Olson Endowment Fund at St. Luke's Hospital. St. Luke's board of directors created the fund in recognition of Olson's substantial contributions to both St. Luke's and the communities it serves. The fund will support the hospital's ability to continue to provide care for patients with insufficient financial resources, provide funding for innovations and collaborations to ensure the best possible care for patients, improve current technology and recruit high quality staff and physicians to St. Luke's Hospital.

## Langenberg Chair for Internal Medicine

The Langenberg Chair for Internal Medicine was created by Mary Langenberg and her husband, the late Oliver Langenberg, in honor of the late Paul Mennes, MD, former Chief of Medicine. The fund will support the operations of the Internal Medicine Department.

## Marvin and Harlene Wool Cardiology Fund

The Marvin and Harlene Wool Cardiology Fund was established in honor of Maged Haikal, MD and the Department of Cardiology at St. Luke's Hospital. Funds will support the operations of cardiology services, including education of staff and physicians, medical equipment and technology.

## Friends of St. Luke's

The Friends of St. Luke's are families, physicians, community members and business leaders who promote philanthropic support to enhance the mission and strategic vision of St. Luke's Hospital for the health of the community. The Friends of St. Luke's contributed \$815,000 this year through the generous gifts of more than 900 donors, surpassing their \$640,000 goal. The Friends of St. Luke's leadership, commitment and involvement throughout the community reinforces St. Luke's dedication to medical excellence.

## Young Friends of St. Luke's

The Young Friends of St. Luke's is a dynamic group of young professionals, volunteers and physicians dedicated to promoting a healthy lifestyle in the community, providing social and business networking opportunities, and supporting St. Luke's Hospital by increasing awareness and raising funds. Formed in 2012, The Young Friends hosted a number of fundraising events and participated in community health programs this year.

## Tour de Wellness

Through two cycling events held last spring and fall, the St. Luke's Hospital Tour de Wellness brought together more than 800 cyclists to celebrate health, wellness and active living in our community. Tour de Wellness offers cyclists of all levels an opportunity to participate in a safe and inspirational ride with three course options. Nonprofit partners and corporate sponsors collaborate with St. Luke's.


