3 St. Luke's Emergency Care:

A life-threatening condition that requires immediate medical attention.

Symptoms that may indicate a life-threatening emergency include:

- Chest pain or pressure that may radiate to the arm, neck, back, shoulder, jaw or wrist
- Sudden onset of weakness or numbness of the face, arm or leg; slurred speech, blurred vision or loss of balance
- Sudden, severe abdominal pain
- Severe shortness of breath
- Major injuries such as deep wounds, severe burns or motor vehicle accidents
- Allergic reactions
- Loss of consciousness
- Uncontrollable bleeding
